Programs & Activities Descriptions

Adult B'nei Mitzvah: Opportunity for men and women to become Bar/Bat Mitzvah under the supervision of the Rabbi and Cantor.

Adult Choir: Under the direction of the Cantor, the choir rehearses Thursdays 10:00 am to 12:00 pm and sings once a month at Friday night services.

Adult Education Committee: Works with the Educational Director to develop programs and enhance the congregation's awareness of all aspects of Judaism.

Ambassador Program: Connect Temple Members (Ambassadors) with New Members to help those new members to be integrated into the Temple community.

Brotherhood (Auxiliary): Men who are working and those who are retired, focus on social events, social action, religious-based activities for this group and fundraising for the Temple.

Chai Connection: Send packages to Temple member college students.

Finance Committee: Works with the Treasurer to develop the budget and present monthly reports to the board.

Fund Raising Committee (Ways & Means): Works with the Vice President of Ways & Means to establish, develop, co-ordinate and implement plans to raise funds throughout the Congregation and community.

Havurot Coordination: Interact & assist with the content & coordination of various special interest Havurah.

Library Committee: Works with the Vice-President of Education, to oversee the maintenance and upkeep of the Library, including selecting and cataloguing materials and maintaining pertinent records.

Membership Committee: Works with the Vice President of Membership, to develop programs for recruiting and welcoming new members and for integrating and retaining current members.

Office Projects: Helps with mailings, collates membership kits

Parent-Teacher Organization (PTO): Works with the President of PTO. Supports the religious school.

Religious School Committee: Works with the Vice President of Education, to assist in the educational program of the religious school under the supervision of the Rabbi and the educational director.

Religious Services (Ritual) Committee: Works with the Vice-President of Religious Services and assists the Rabbi and Cantor with all aspects of services and religious rituals.

Singles Mingle by TSS: Men & Women (ages 35-55), Temple members and non-members.

Sisterhood (Auxiliary): Sponsors Judaica Shop; monthly luncheon-speaker programs; supports Temple initiatives.

Social Action Committee: Works with the Vice President of Religious Services and serves as a liaison between the Temple and the community on interfaith relations; matters of social action and social justice.

Tot Shabbat: A special 5:30-6:15 pm Friday afternoon Shabbat Service for children up to eight years old and their families.

Youth Groups: Works with the Vice-President of Education. Two Youth groups, Jr. STARY for grades 6-8 and Sr. STARY for grades 9-12, provide opportunities for social, religious and educational experiences for our Temple youth.
