RABBI'S FORUM

Rabbi Anthony Fratello, MAHL

We had an open house on August 13, which was wonderful. We had about two-dozen interested families come and spend some time learning about the Shaarei Shalom Community and getting to know some of our members. In the crowd were a handful of people who had visited or worshipped with us before, and there were also people who had never stepped foot in the synagogue before. We had older individuals, and we had younger parents raising Jewish Children. As I am sure you can imagine, the interest ran the gamut: there were those who wanted opportunities to pray, there were those who wanted opportunities to learn, and still others who just wanted a place to belong.

If you are reading these words, think back to that time when YOU were a prospective new member. We probably had a chance to sit and talk, and no doubt I asked the regular kinds of questions I like to ask new members. Where are you from? What kind of work do you do/did you do? What are you looking for in a new congregational home?

I was most impressed with one of the younger attendees at the Open House, someone who will hopefully one day stand on our Bema becoming an Adult in the Jewish Community. When asked about their background, this young person said, simply, "I am a human being!"

I am a human being! What a wonderful, and critically important statement.

So often we get caught up in who we are: young or old, rich, or poor, learned, or unlettered, that we fail to see and understand who our fellow travelers on the road of life may be. We know all too well how this happens outside of these walls, far too often it happens inside these walls too! I myself am guilty of it; just reread how I described the people who came to our open house. Sure, we are all of these different things, but at the end of the day, we are also all the same. We are all human beings created—as we are taught by our tradition—in the image of God. This is how we start.

No doubt by now you have heard some of the news I have let slip about these High Holidays. I encourage you to come and listen. On Rosh Hashanah I have something that I want to give you. And, on Yom Kippur, I've got something that I have to ask you. The future of this community hinges on the answers.

Cantor's Corner

Cantor Carry Barry, MSM

One of the most groundbreaking archaeological discoveries in the past few decades is found in southeastern Turkey at a site called *Gobekli Tepe*. Its massive carved stones are about 11,000 years old, predating Stonehenge by six millennia. Constructed by prehistoric people who had not yet developed metal tools or even pottery, *Gobekli Tepe* may be the site of the world's oldest temple.

The discovery has shaken a long-held belief that such structures only came after humans learned to farm and settled in communities, assuming that, only then, would they have the time and resources. But the archaeologist who led the excavation at *Gobekli Tepe* argued it may have been the other way around, suggesting that perhaps it was the coordinated effort of building which led to the development of complex societies.

Torah teaches us that after delivering the Ten Commandments to the Israelites at Mount Sinai, God continues to reveal the Torah directly to Moses. Among God's earliest instructions are the words "V'asu li mikdash v'shachanti b'tocham," commonly translated as "Build Me a sanctuary so that I may dwell among them" (Exodus 25:8).

The first *mikdash* was temporary, accompanying the Israelites on their journey through the wilderness. Once in the Promised Land, altars were built at multiple sites until a couple hundred years later when worship became centralized at the Temple in Jerusalem. When the Romans destroyed the Temple in the first century, the Jewish people, exiled from their land and spread out across the Roman Empire and beyond, were forced to find new ways to worship the One and Only God. Synagogues, houses of meeting, study and prayer became the new normal. This verse from Exodus may have been an inspiration to our early rabbis. God did not tell Moses to build "the Temple" (*Beit HaMikdash*), but rather a "*mikdash*," a tabernacle, or sanctuary. No particular

location. Just build one, so that the people will gather together and become a community.

As we prepare for the holidays, it may help to take a closer look at the last word of our Torah verse; b'tocham, so often translated as "among them," may also be translated as "within them." That is the key: it is not the building, or the sanctuary, or the tickets or the ushers. It is you. It is me. It's all of us. God dwells within each of us as long as we make the space, and when we gather together as a sacred community, how much more so do we experience God's strength and light.

I look forward to seeing you over the coming weeks as we celebrate our New Year and all that comes with it. May this New Year bring us joy and inspiration as we continue the sacred work of building together.

August 2023

Rabbi Fratello noted that he has been actively engaging with various groups in TSS to share his BUILDING UP proposal. Response has been positive...but, as he says, "Now the real work begins."

Cantor Barry shared details of the re-shaped Family Service, each of which will have a theme. Please join in this experience on the second Friday of each month. It matters that our congregational family worships together and shares in the joy of Shabbat together.

The URJ's Religious Action Center (RAC) is locally led and works with Reform congregations and communities to build a more just and compassionate Florida. To this end, there is a Reproductive Freedom Campaign seeking to gather petition signatures throughout the state to assure a Reproductive Freedom amendment on the 2024 ballot. The Board endorses this initiative, and a committee is being created to enable us to support this effort. Please contact Jay if you can participate.

The Board approved a clarification of Committee and Auxiliary responsibilities and will soon be implementing a Strategic Planning calendar of programs.

Kudos to Lisa Tenenbaum and Caryn Feldman for facilitating a successful Open House...and to the staff, Board members, Youth Group, and others who lent their support.

The Board approved a new Gatekeeper category of \$500 to permit more members to enhance their dues payment and support their temple.

B'Nei Mitzvah fees have not been increased in many years. The Board approved increasing the fee to \$1500, beginning with the incoming 5th graders.

Finally, the Board approved opening Religious School Grades 2 & 3 to non-members (new families only) for the 2023-2024 school year.


