Education Update

Shalom to all. These past two months have been challenging for the Jewish community. However, I am thankful! When I see the smiling faces of our students, when I listen to the various voices blending during worship services, and when I see generations celebrating Shabbat and holidays together, it brings me joy, and hope.

The mission of the TSS Religious School is to educate students in all aspects of Judaism, enabling them to make informed choices and shape their Jewish identity within the Reform community and the Jewish community at large. However, our immediate goal is for our students to enjoy their time here, create friendships and experience the joy of Judaism, so that they will feel the synagogue is a warm and welcoming space for them and their families now and throughout their lives.

We have specific curriculum blocks for the different grade levels and teachers plan together and with me to create lessons and activities that are fun and engaging. Each year, we host school wide learning days, such as Hanukkah Happening, Tu B'shvat Scavenger hunt, or an interactive seder. Our teachers are encouraged to be creative and to use the spaces inside and outside the building, so that students are not confined to the classroom.

Grades Kindergarten – Third Grade These first years are the foundation of our students' Jewish education. Students are introduced to Torah and Jewish holidays and become comfortable in the Temple. They learn Hebrew vocabulary through Hebrew Through Movement. Each week, students also pray and sing with the Cantor in the Sanctuary during Kehillah. We invite the parents to participate with their children in the Sanctuary @ 11:30 AM.

Grades 4-6: Students will receive the foundations that will bring the wisdom of Jewish tradition to their contemporary life. They will approach their Torah study with the enduring understanding that Torah study is lifelong and ongoing. They will explore the core values found in the Torah. They will also cover topics such as Jewish American History and Israel. They will continue to decode Hebrew and learn the blessings and prayers that not only will help them in their B'nei Mitzvah, but also will form the foundations that will allow them to participate as Jewish adults in the larger Jewish community. In addition to the Sunday classes, students have a weekly Hebrew lesson here at TSS or virtually.

Grade 7: This is the bridge between adolescence and adulthood. These students are exploring, questioning, and maturing as they go through the B'nei Mitzvah year. The students will begin the year by reviewing T'filot (prayers), but the focus of the year will be finding their personal connection to Judaism, examining the Holocaust, debating contemporary Jewish issues, and learning about the Modern state of Israel. B'nei Mitzvah is not an ending point, but rather an important part of the journey. Therefore, we expect that our students will continue to our Teen/Tichon program and be part of the Confirmation Class in their 10th Grade year. Confirmation students will study with the Rabbi and Cantor and will lead a Friday night service to commemorate this simcha.

Grades 8-12: Teen/Tichon (Post B'nei Mitzvah/10th Grade Confirmation: Our high school students will continue to explore Jewish Issues and values as they apply to their busy lives today through interactive, engaging, and entertaining classes. Once per month, Guest speakers help us explore topical issues. Students do monthly Mitzvah projects and enjoy time to socialize. As these students mature, we look forward to their continued involvement in our Religious School as Madrichim (Teacher assistants.)

STARY YOUTH GROUP: STARY Senior 8th-12th Grade, STARY Jr. 6th /7th Grade, L'il STARY 4th/5th Grade Opportunities for social and educational programming that help to strengthen the relationships they have made at TSS. As high school students, they will have access to activities within the Palm Beach Jewish community and can also take part in national events though NFTY, the National Youth organization of the Reform Movement.

From our President

These are incredibly challenging times we are living in. What started with the terrorist attacks on October 7th has quickly found its way to our own community. You have all heard of the increase in antisemitism. We experienced it first-hand receiving the bomb threat email that hundreds of Jewish institutions across the US received. Our children had to experience this and while we did a fantastic job with their physical safety, we must now address their emotional well-being.

What is extremely concerning is what is happening on the college campuses. Our families are subjected to physical and emotional threats at colleges and universities. Jewish students are themselves challenging what is happening in Israel and becoming anti-Zionists – even anti-Jewish.

It is possible to have two ideas at once. The Reform Movement is unequivocal about Israel's right to defend itself. It is not only defending the country but Jewish peoplehood. At the same time, we have concerns about the humanitarian crisis in Gaza and Hamas's tactics of using civilians as human shields.

For your college students, we can provide resources to help them deal with the situation on their campus.

This war will be over – hopefully sooner rather than later. We need to have a voice in Israel.

ARZA (Association of Reform Zionists of America) plays a pivotal role in promoting the values of Reform Judaism in Israel, advocating for religious pluralism, and working towards a more inclusive and progressive society. By joining ARZA, you contribute directly to the well-being of Israel and help shape its future as a democratic and just society.

Now, more than ever, it is crucial for us to stand together and support Israel. As we navigate through challenging times, our connection with the land, culture, and people of Israel serves as a source of strength and unity. Education is offering a Sunday Morning Breakfast Series on current issues.


The Friends & Family program is being terminated. Under the new program you may receive a one-time credit of \$50 or \$100.

Israel Matters

"Israel Has Your Heart, Now Lend a Hand"

Many Americans are standing With Israel by standing IN Israel as volunteers.

Since the start of the war on October 7, 2023, labor has been in short supply due to hundreds of thousands of Israelis called up for reserve duty, foreign workers leaving the country, and many people unable to get to their workplaces because of war-related childcare or safety issues.

A Christian Zionist group called HaYovel based in the West Bank is responsible, for example, for bringing "The Cowboys," a group of four cowboy volunteers who are helping in agricultural roles. One young man from Montana said that while they do not have pineapples in Montana, he is happy to roll up his sleeves and help harvest them in Israel.

Another group that has garnered widespread media attention Is **the Emergency Volunteers Program (EVP).** It is best known for its firefighters' program, but during the war has expanded its projects to include a Mass Feeding Unit that prepares fresh, healthy meals for IDF soldiers and a Make a Soldier Smile project that has volunteers cooking meals at pop up field kitchens on military bases.

If you would like to live and work on a IDF base, you can check out Volunteers for Israel (www.vfi-usa.org) and Sar-El (www.sar-el.org) which have hundreds of volunteers packing supplies for medics and combat soldiers.

Israeli tech companies are also short-handed as 15-20 % of tech employees have been mobilized for reserve duty. **Startup Reserves for Israel**, based in New York, is recruiting thousands of volunteers to offer support, guidance, and staffing to twenty-five companies in Israel's high-tech sector.

Here are just a few of the many other volunteer programs available:

Mission Hinenu works in conjunction with the Health Ministry to process paperwork for both medical professionals and non-medical personnel able to come to Israel to volunteer.

Adopt-A-Safta brings foreign volunteers with access to a vehicle to deliver Shabbat meals to isolated seniors on Friday mornings.

Birthright Israel alumni, ages 18-40, can volunteer for 2-weeks in food rescue operations. **Masa Israel Journey** offers a 6-week project where participants may choose among several volunteer projects assisting displaced families in the southern and northern parts of the country.

Many other programs are listed online. Your TSS Israel Committee encourages you to roll up your sleeves and join in to do a mitzvah.


