### Cantor's Corner

#### Cantor Carry Barry, MSM

It is with great anticipation that I write to you at this moment, just before an extraordinary weekend for me and my family and a special time for our congregation. You may wonder why we chose to schedule my Installation service for the weekend of our son Eli's Bar Mitzvah. To me, it just made sense. Of course, friends and family coming from out of town could be with us for both wonderful occasions, but more importantly, we could, as a congregation, celebrate a weekend of welcoming: officially welcoming your new Cantor to Temple Shaarei Shalom and welcoming Eli into his new community as a Jewish adult. I was thrilled that Eli was happy to share "his" weekend with me and that you will be able to celebrate with our entire family on Friday, February 2.

I don't know about you, but when I hear the word "installation," my mind immediately goes to household appliances, like in that 1985 Dire Straits song "Money for Nothing" where they sing "we got to install microwave ovens, custom kitchen deliveries." Then again, I grew up on MTV—back when music videos played most of the day and long before reality television took over.

In actuality, the term "installation" has been used for centuries in reference to the formal rite where a pastor is publicly placed into their role in a specific congregation. Unlike the swearing in of a public servant, however, an installation of clergy is much more like a brit, a covenant, between the clergy person and the congregation. It marks the beginning of a unique relationship. As the clergy is installed, promising to take on the spiritual care of the congregation, the installation service itself should also underscore the congregation's responsibility to its pastor. In formally recognizing the man or woman as their pastor, a congregation also commits to learn from him or her, to show honor and respect, and, if they are able, to provide for his or her material needs. While a clergy person is ordained only once in their life, they are "installed" each time they begin their tenure with a new congregation.

In essence, the installation acknowledges that, much like a marriage, our journeys have become interconnected and that we will care for each other in both joy and sadness, through good times and more challenging ones. As I head into the weekend, I hold this beautiful prayer by Rabbi Rachel Barenblat in my heart:

Dear One, You Who are near as the blood in my veins, *Ribbono shel Olam,* You Who are grandly distant as galaxies unfolding, be with me as I accept responsibility for this community. Strengthen my arms as I cradle Your children in celebration and in sorrow, sustain my heart that I may open other hearts to Your presence, uplift my spirit that I may lead prayer which makes You manifest, help me to learn, to teach and to live Your Torah when I minister to my own family and to this family. Holy One of Blessing, consecrate my hands to Your service.

### **Education Update**

I just returned from the Reform Jewish Educators Conference in Memphis. Over 300 leaders of Reform Jewish educational communities from all over the country met to discuss how we can help more families connect to our congregations and develop a true sense of belonging.

We started by defining the difference between welcoming and belonging. Welcoming is how we greet people, and actually encourage them to enter our spaces. Belonging is why people choose to stay! They create connections and feel a sense of commitment and responsibility to the community. They care about what is happening there and want to help to forward the mission of the organization. It is a reciprocal relationship.

We explored the work of Marshall Ganz, a renowned professor and author from Harvard who has done extensive work on leadership and organizing. He uses this quote from Hillel, a famous sage from Talmudic times, as the basis of his work. "If I am not for myself, who will be for me? If I am only for myself, who and I? If not now, when?" Dr. Ganz states that this quote translates into three questions that focus on the interdependence of self, other, and action. What are we called to do? Who are the others that we are in relationship with, and what action does the world in which we live demand of us now?

This made me think about two important events that happened in January. The first is the holiday of Tu B'shvat, the birthday of the trees. The Torah tells us that we shall not eat the fruit of the trees for three years. Later Rabbis of the Talmud, more specifically, Hillel, chose the 15th day of Shevat, Tu B'shvat, to be the official day of this holiday. In more recent times, the meanings have taken on additional meanings, and reminds us of our responsibility as caretakers of our natural resources, the environment, and the planet. This relates directly to our interdependence with one another, and the need for us to act, now, to ensure our future. One way to honor this important day is to plant trees in Israel.

On the last Shabbat of January, we participated in the Komen Pink Walk and held our annual minyan at the Komen. It is a powerful experience to see so many people in the Palm Beach community working together to raise money to fight cancer and to support, honor and remember those who have been affected by it. This brings us back to the words of Hillel and reminds us that We must all work together to help those in need, for the greater good of the community, and we must do it now.

On February 11th, we will welcome Tracey Labgold from Keshet to our breakfast series. She will explain why LGBTQ+ rights are a Jewish Value and help us to understand why it is vital for us, as Jews, to support and defend this community. This is another reminder of the significance of welcoming and creating belonging for everyone in our TSS community.

Finally, this year we will celebrate Purim twice! On Sunday, 3/10, STARY will host Purim Palooza to benefit Camp Jenny, here at TSS at 12 PM. There will be games, food, hamentashen, and a DJ. #### **Israel Matters**

#### ISRAEL, INNOVATION and AUTISM

While the war rages on in Israel, the TSS Israel Committee wants to again focus your attention on the amazing advances in science and technology that this tiny country has shared with the world community.

Do you know a person with autism—a family member, friend, neighbor, or colleague? Maybe it is you. Ramon Tubin, a former chief technology officer at a digital services company in Israel has a son, Yuval, who lives with autism. Tubin decided his heart was no longer in his work, so he left his position at Pangea IT--determined to do something to benefit his son and the more than three hundred million autistic people worldwide.

Four years ago on Yuval's 19th birthday, Tubin launched the first **Hackautism Hackathon**. Each year, the organization issues invitations via social media and newsletters to over one million stakeholders, including parents of autistic children and others who discovered the needs of this community through military service or volunteering. These stakeholders are asked to submit entrepreneurial ideas to develop real solutions for challenges faced by those with autism. Eventually twenty-five ideas are presented at a two-day hackathon, with programmers, designers and product developers from various disciplines working with the creators to develop their ideas.

Here are some initiatives from the past few years:

FUN FRIENDS: an AI app that connects autistic children based on their geographic location and interests.

**POPPINS**: The world's first streaming channel designed for people who experience and interact with the world in different ways. Netflix for the neurodiverse!

**DiVE**: An AI platform that helps employers identify and hire workers with autism.

Last year's Hackathon included two hundred ideas from twenty-five different countries.


