RABBI'S FORUM

Adar II, the Revenge!

Just kidding, although this year on the Hebrew Calendar is a leap year, just like on the Secular Calendar. The main difference, however, is that instead of adding one day on a Hebrew Calendar leap year we add an entire additional month. This happens from time to time. Truth be told it happens nine times every 17 years. When I was still in Rabbinical School, I even remembered the pattern for how it went, but it has slipped my mind, and that spot in my head is filled instead with how to sing Oseh Shalom to the tune of It's a Small World, thanks Cantor!

So, like I said, this year we have two Adars. But, why?

The Hebrew Calendar is a Lunar Calendar; that is to say it is keyed to the cycles of the moon. The New Moon is the first day of the New Month. For that reason, it will always be a full moon at your First Night Seder (15th of the Month of Nisan). It will always be a full moon on the First Night of Sukkot (15th of the Month of Tishri). It will always be a New Moon on Rosh Hashanah (1st of Tishri), you get the idea. From that standpoint it is not dissimilar to what occurs in other traditions. For example, our friends and neighbors in the Muslim Community also make use of a Lunar Calendar.

That being said... this is where it starts to heat up.

For those of you who know, the Lunar Calendar differs from the Solar Calendar by about 11 days. Again, this is noticeable in Islam as the Holy Month of Ramadan floats through the year. Some of you may remember that a number of years ago Ramadan, Christmas, and Hanukkah all overlapped, whereas last year Ramadan was at Pesakh. (This year it is even earlier!) So... nu... why doesn't this happen with the Hebrew Calendar too? Why do we never celebrate Pesakh in October, or have Yom Kippur in April?

The answer is because the Rabbis added a leap month nine times every 17 years. Adar II keeps the Lunar Calendar and the Solar Calendar more or less in sync. Our Holidays are not only about honoring God and giving thanks for what we have, most of them also have an agricultural element. We tend to forget, but our ancestors lived very close to the land. Pesakh, which is about celebrating our Freedom from Egypt, is also the time when we plant our

crops. Sukkot, which is about giving thanks for the fact that God brought us to the Land of Israel, is also the time when we bring in our crops. If the two were not synced up, we would be planting when we should be reaping, and reaping when we should be sowing. And where would that get us?

This may not seem terribly important or interesting to you, and I get that. To me, however, this is just another way in which our tradition seeks to harmonize the Rituals of our Lives—those wonderful things that make life worth living, with the Practical Needs of our Lives—those things that make life possible. I cannot imagine one without the other.

Cantor's Corner

Cantor Carry Barry, MSM

What a month February was! My heart is full after my Installation, celebrating our son becoming Bar Mitzvah, the delightful Disney service, and even squeezing in a birthday! I thank you all for the many well-wishes, your participation and, again, all of your support. We are slowly making our way through our thank you notes and truly appreciate your patience.

In our Passover Haggadah (and in the Book of Deuteronomy), we read the words “My father was a wandering Aramean.” We then recount the story of the Israelites’ experience in Egypt and miraculous exodus. Why do we read these words each year when so many of us are settled, some for generations? These words remind us, not only of where we came from, but of the reality that our situation has not been guaranteed. Throughout our history, Jewish communities existing for a thousand years have been forced to leave not just the land of Israel, but the Iberian Peninsula, the German Rhineland, numerous areas of the Middle East, and beyond. Sadly, the current rise in antisemitism has brought up, once again, feelings of concern and even fear. We cannot help but wonder what the coming years are going to bring.

To be able to feel settled is a true gift and one, I think, many tend to take for granted. As we look ahead into March and April, I am reminded of a saying we had during our Year-in-Israel program as part of our Rabbinic and Cantorial studies: “Purim, Pesach, packing.” As students on a yearlong study abroad program that had begun the previous June, the saying was a reminder that the next few months, would fly by and we’d soon be on our way back to the United States. While there had, of course, been much more going on, Purim, Pesach and packing were definitely the things that stood out the most during those last weeks in Israel.

At this time last year, as my family prepared to leave Jacksonville for our journey south, it had become my mantra once again. (Although, in reality, it was more like “packing, Purim, packing, Pesach, packing.”) Knowing that I was leaving did nothing to diminish my desire to make sure the congregation had wonderful experiences and our holiday celebrations took on added depth as everyone anticipated the upcoming transition. There seemed to be tears wherever I turned as we all engaged in the longest good-bye ever.

This year, as I look toward a Shabbat on the Beach, Purim, multiple Passover seders, other holiday observances, and working with our new Volunteer Choir, I appreciate more fully than ever before the sense of calm I feel. There will be

no packing this spring. And while that may sound trite, for me, the statement holds so much more than those simple words.

I know that I have found my home. I will not take it for granted as I will always remember the journey that has led me to this place. And while I will fully revel in the peace I feel, I will remain vigilant, knowing that peace is not a guarantee, but something we must always be working toward.

May this time of renewal be one of hope and peace for our troubled world. Let us all learn from where we’ve been so that we can face the future with wisdom, empathy, and compassion.

From the Board Room February 2024

A job description is being developed by a committee of Board and congregants for the position of Director of Education. Following this, the position will be posted, and a Search Committee (again of Board and congregants) will continue the process.


